Introduction

The Call vs The Calling

- To be called by God is simply to be chosen by God for a specific purpose. Galatians 1:13-16
 - In the NT, the one word used for "called" is Kaleo which means "To call aloud, utter in a love voice or to invite"
 - Galatians 1:6, 1 Corinthians 1:9
 - The other word used kletos is used as an (adjective) which means called, invited but also means called to some office {divinely selected and appointed}
 - Romans 1:1; Romans 1:6 1 Corinthians 1:2
- The issue of our Christian culture is the perception of what it means to be called. 1 Corinthians 10:31

God's Plan

- Every human being has a call to fulfill in this life. Genesis 3:15
- To impact the affairs of history and affect align His purpose on earth. Jeremiah 27:6; Isaiah 45:1;4
- To restore the earth to its original value through the gospel. 2 Corinthians 5:20

- Calling to a work (vocation); Genesis 1:27-28; Ephesians 2:10; 2 Thess. 3:10
- Calling to Life 1 Timothy 5:8
- Calling to Ministry; Amos 7:14; Romans 1:6

- What do you think everyone else should be doing?
- What are the things you have thought about doing, never followed through but for some reason, you can't shake it off?
- What has the Lord been impressing on your heart as you seek him?

Conclusion:

The calling of God is on every human being, and they will fulfill it whether they believe in God or not. The advantage for the believer is that we are aware of this truth. Thus, it is incumbent on us to pursue God and work hard to fulfill our calling in our families, work, community and the world at large to see the hand and purpose of God fulfilled in our life.





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Introduction: Matthew 24:14

Topic: Living Out Your Faith at Home Text: Joshua 12:1-15, Math 5:14-15,

Date: January 19, 2025



Introduction

Last week, Pastor Yaw spoke about "Different Pulpits for Different People". We were encouraged to use every avenue God gives us to preach the gospel and reminded that we are all ministers in this world, with our ordination beginning the day we got born again. Building on that, today, I want us to examine **how to live out our faith at home**. Our homes are the *first pulpit* we have, a place where faith should be evident in *our daily lives*. If we cannot reflect Christ in our closest relationships, how can we effectively share Him with the world? Let us explore what it means to honor God in our households and be a light to those closest to us.

1. A Call to Choose (Joshua 24:15)

- Context: Joshua challenges Israel to decide whom they will serve after recounting God's faithfulness.
- Key Lesson: Faith begins with *a deliberate choice*. Family members must decide daily to honor and serve God in their homes.

Application:

- Leadership in Faith: Take responsibility to lead your household spiritually (Ephesians 6:4).
- Rejecting Compromise: At home guard yourself from cultural distractions and worldly influences (Romans 12:2).

2. Shine as Lights at Home (Matthew 5:14-16)

- Context: Jesus calls His followers the "light of the world" in the Sermon on the Mount.
- Key Lesson: Faith must shine at home first. A Christ-centered home radiates love, peace, and hope to others.

Application:

- Light Starts at Home: Your family should see your faith in action daily (Colossians 3:12-14).
- Visibility and Testimony: Reflect Christ through acts of love and kindness (Ephesians 4:32).
- Light in the Darkness: Be a source of hope in a broken world (Philippians 2:15).

3. Demonstrating faith at Home

- 1. Be submissive: Eph 5:21
- 2. Be hardworking (excellence): Dan 6:3
- 3. Be a peacemaker: Math 5:9
- 4. Prioritize worship and bible studies: Pray and study Scripture with the family (Deuteronomy 6:6-7).
- 5. Practice Christlike Love: Show patience, forgiveness, and humility (1 Corinthians 13:4-7).
- 6. Guard Your Influence: Avoid worldly distractions and teach your family to stand firm in faith (Proverbs 22:6).

Conclusion

Living out your faith at home begins with a deliberate choice, as Joshua declared, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord" (Joshua 24:15). This choice requires spiritual leadership, resisting worldly distractions (Romans 12:2), and prioritizing God in daily life. Jesus calls us to be the "light of the world" (Matthew 5:14), and that light must shine first in our homes through acts of love, kindness, and forgiveness (Ephesians 4:32). Let us commit to making our homes places where God is honored, His love is evident, and His light shines brightly.
